



CHECKLIST

THAT MUST ACCOMPANY ALL PAPERS SUBMITTED TO THE PERUVIAN JOURNAL OF GYNECOLOGY AND OBSTETRICS

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GENERAL

- The author(s) has (have) filled out the Affidavit of Authorship and authorization for publication of the scientific article in the Journal.
- The manuscript is submitted electronically in Spanish and English or English only, with the Affidavit of Authorship and this Checklist.
- The manuscript is written in Times New Roman font size 12, double-spaced, and includes tables, figures and algorithms.
- The pages have been numbered consecutively.
- Only standard abbreviations have been included, with their meaning the first time they are mentioned.

FIRST PAGE

- The title, author(s) name(s), affiliation(s), ORCID iD and e-mail of each author, source of funding for the study, conflicts of interest and ethical considerations have been written on the first page.
- The name, address, telephone number and e-mail address of the author to whom correspondence should be sent.
- The title of the paper has no more than 100 letters and spaces and no abbreviations.

ABSTRACT

- For original papers, case reports and systematic reviews, the abstract and resumen are limited to 250, 125 and 250 words, respectively, according to the Information for Authors of the Rev peru ginecol obstet.
- No more than 10 keywords and palabras clave are added, according to DECS-Bireme/MeSH.

REFERENCES

See the Information for Authors of the Peruvian Journal of Gynecology and Obstetrics.

- References are identified in the text by numbers with superscript effect, e.g. Perez⁽³⁾, or in parentheses (3).

- The citation of each reference in the respective section follows the Vancouver / PubMed style.
- References are numbered consecutively, according to the order in which they appear in the text.
- Unpublished data and personal communications are not listed in the bibliographic references.
- The abbreviations of the names of medical journals are in accordance with those used in the Index Medicus.
- No period is used after the authors' initials. A period is used at the end of medical journal abbreviations and at the end of each reference, except after doi.

TABLES

- The tables are numbered with Arabic numerals.
- Each table contains the necessary information, summarizing and graphing what is explained in the text.
- The tables are short and do not include information expressed in more detail in the text.
- No more than six tables are sent.

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
